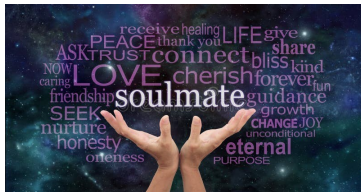


PALM Dementia café
