Letter from the Manse:

Dear Friends,

It is with a heavy heart that I share with you that I am to leave Currie to move back to the USA. I announced to our Session and congregation on 6th August that this was a tough decision, as I have loved being your minister these past eight years.

It has been my privilege to get to know each of you and to share in so many of your joys as well as your suffering. From our spirited Sunday worship complete with baptisms, as well as knitting hats for refugees and the snack lunches and guild outings. ... to our shared grief as we experienced the loss of some really wonderful members, it has been my honour to be part of the Currie community.

I know that the last few years have been so tough on all of you, especially as we endured the isolation and uncertainty of the Covid lockdown. Then the Presbytery plan presented a new uncertainty about the future of our Kirk. But I prayerfully trust that God will guide you, and all our neighbouring Parishes together as you move forward into a new era. God's spirit will surely empower you, along with Presbytery, to reshape positive and exciting new ministries across Colinton, Juniper Green, Currie and Balerno.

Personally, since my Mum died, I have felt a yearning to be closer to friends and family across the Atlantic. I am excited to begin a new ministry with a little certainty. I have accepted a call to Centre Presbyterian Church in Pennsylvania. Like Currie, it is a warm hearted, caring congregation, and very proud of its Scottish roots! The church, founded in 1781has a strong history, but it is nowhere near as old as Currie Kirk, which as you know was founded in 1140!

I want to thank you from my heart for your kindness to me over these eight years. I will miss all of you so much – friends with whom I could laugh and pray.

Heather's Ministry

Holiday Club 2023!

From the 24th-28th July I had the opportunity to lead a team of wonderful people as we served God at holiday club down at Heriot Watt. We welcomed 46 children, the number growing as the week went on!

Our theme for the week was The Great Glen Green Welly Garden Show, and our programme was filled with games, drama, Bible exploration, crafts, snacks and songs. One of the highlights for me was the song time. Throughout the week we sang truths that proclaimed who God is and what he's like. The loudest proclamation being that of "Allelu, allelu, praise ye the Lord" – a noise I'm sure was heard far away as the children competed to see which team could be the loudest! However watching and hearing the children joyfully singing out the greatness and goodness and love of God is heart-warming.

Our Bible theme over the week was the overarching storyline of Scripture. On day 1 we looked at creation, where God made everything perfect and made people in His image. On day 2 we discover God's perfect world is spoiled by human choices. Day 3 we learnt that the prophets reminded people to "put God first", and that even when we get it wrong God still loves us and there was hope that someone would come to restore the world and fix the problem of sin. Day 4 focused on the cross, discovering that Jesus is the only one who can save our broken world and fix the mess of sin. Finally, we looked ahead to God making a new perfect world and that we are all invited to be part of God's family and plan. To demonstrate the theme of salvation and restoration further we had a show garden which began beautiful and perfect, got spoiled and destroyed as the week continued, but by the end was restored and renewed and everyone was invited to add to and enjoy it.

We were encouraged by the way every child engaged with the teaching and the small group discussions. Walking around the groups during that time it was lovely to see all the children taking part and asking questions. One of the activities we did on Thursday was to decorate crosses. First the children wrote on the crosses examples of sin, either that they were aware of in themselves or in the world in general. They then spread grout over the writing and placed on pieces of broken mosaic tiles to represent the brokenness of the world. They then picked up glass beads and spoke out things to be thankful for and stuck them into the spaces left on the cross. The final results are beautiful pieces of art that speak both of the brokenness and beauty of the cross. Two of these are on display in the Sunshine Corner at Currie Kirk.

There were many small yet precious memories created throughout the week – seeing the oldest ones looking out for and helping the youngest ones; small hands slipping into those of team members as they walked; deep questions being asked and answered by children; seeing families at our Friday Garden Party mingling with each other and with team members as we enjoyed the warm sunshine that finally came out; young people being bold and brave enough to share their talents and creativity with others. We are so grateful to the parents for entrusting us with their precious children for the week, both a responsibility and a privilege for us.

On Thursday we were given the opportunity to add to the environment we borrowed from Heriot Watt. Two of the landscaping team made it possible for each child to do some planting of heather and hydrangea. There were lots of muddy hands and smiling faces from enthusiastic children, and the men who helped us said it was the highlight of their day. So if you walk down by the Chaplaincy Centre at Heriot Watt, then take a few moments to admire the new plants hand placed by local children.















Finally, on Friday during group time the children were given invitations to know Jesus better. If they wanted to fill it in, there were 4 boxes they could choose from – definitely yes, maybe yes, maybe no, and not interested. From the 37 completed invitations, which were all done privately with no pressure to share their response, there were 5 who ticked maybe yes, and 32 who chose definitely yes. There was also space for them to write why they chose that reply and some of the reasons given included - because God is good, because they trust God, because they believe, and because God loves them. One child wrote "because I love God so much and it would be such an honour". I don't know who gave a response or which one they gave, but I pray that each of those children will have the opportunity to find out more about who God is and come to follow Him for themselves. More than that, I give thanks that they ended the week knowing that, above all else, God loves them. It is likely we will never know the exact work God did in each life that week, but I pray that the seeds of love planted in each child by God and by the example of the incredible team will go deep into their hearts and minds. I hope that along with the memories of fun and silliness, they will remember the stories, the verses, the words of the songs that they took part in for 5 mornings this summer.

Thank you to everyone who had a part in making this year's holiday club happen – you are all incredibly special and very appreciated.

Diane Brown and I met with Natalia (Edinburgh City Mission) and Teresa (St. Mungo's Church) to chat about the work that is already being done in other parts of Edinburgh and what we can do to extend a hand of friendship to those who have fled War, Unrest, Persecution and Intolerance and find themselves living in EH14. Many have left parents & family behind and have arrived in Edinburgh with few possessions and not knowing our language, culture or way of life.

Their new lives are so very different from what they knew & understood. Most have fled their home countries to seek safety and better lives for their children.

Integration is an important aspect of their successful resettlement.

We are starting off with a Fun Afternoon on Saturday 14th October 2023, 2-5pm at our Gibson Craig Hall and we would love you to join with us and participate in this new venture. If we can attract more helpers, then we will be able to offer this friendly welcoming space on a more regular basis.
